The changes we are making - and have been over the last few years, has seen a completely different way of working. Alongside the Libraries I have the IT and Media services and so we don't actually have a "library" team any longer. So they have had a huge amount to learn already, seen the collection "devalued" and now the innovative and digital spaces are really pushing their boundaries. They have also lost half their library and been working beside a working

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		construction site (to be fair the works have been well managed). And the challenge to get academics and students involved. Each time we "sell" our vision they all nod, get excited and say they trust us ... they have been very passive. Let's see if that changes once the books are gone!

We are very conscious however that there is a potential for STEM to dominate these spaces, along with the associated demographics, and so we're really thinking about how we deal with that. One approach might be to try some targeted approaches with some specific disciplines. It would also be interesting to see if Ciara has noticed any patterns as they have been open for a bit longer than us as a central facility

Louise O'Shea:	University of Limerick	Our space is facilitated by a full-time student on placement, who goes through training and risk Assessments. Users do not have unsupervised access to our equipment
